Sunday Sermon: Christ before Bethlehem

Following on from Paul's statement that the only foundation for the church – of our life - is Christ Jesus, John begins a new series on the life of Christ.

While the popular view is that Jesus' life began with his miraculous birth in Bethlehem, the Bible clearly shows that He was much more than a mere man: he was – and is – eternal and divine.

He existed before he was promised. He was with the Father before time began. As Micah, referring to the pending birth at Bethlehem was to say: *his origin is from of old*. His home was in heaven.

Not only was he pre-existent in heaven but, as the second person of the Trinity, he shared in God's purpose and plans for the world and humanity. He was involved in creation, for "*all things were made by Him*".

Yet, from that glorious pre-existence he "*entered our world, his glory veiled*". He came for a purpose. He came to make redemption possible. He "*left the gaze of angels for the anguish of the cross*" – all to save us.

Why does this matter? It helps us to understand the nature of our salvation and who the Saviour is. It is not casually following a hero, a friend, or a mentor, but a realisation that the Son of God left his eternal throne for our sinful world to die for our sins and to reconcile us to God. That is the Jesus who is the only foundation. A full realisation of that will govern how we worship and the extent of our total commitment.

Church Closure

The current government restrictions required to minimise the spread of the corona virus include the instruction that all places of worship are to be closed at least until the end of January. As we will be complying with the instruction, there will not be any services held in Allander Church for at least the next four weeks. However, John Macleod will still record a sermon each week which will be available on Facebook and the church website.
