A Full Gospel - Romans in a nutshell

Recent ministry has been pointing us towards a new normal. The foundation for that is the gospel – all of it.

Writing to the Romans, Paul took nothing for granted. Presenting it as essentially Jesus Christ, who brought God to man and brings man to God through His sacrifice, he emphasises three elements: the gospel shows what is wrong, offers what is right and provides the power that can put that into effect at three levels.

At the basic level, all my sinful actions are cancelled out - when I believe - by the One Right Action (Calvary) of Jesus, bringing forgiveness and peace with God.

But, the problem goes deeper. It is not what I DO but what I AM. The gospel provides the answer in that the Jesus who died for me will also live instead of me.

Tempted to bask in such great provision focused on us, we are taken on an excursion into who God is and what His purposes are, resulting in a challenge to change our mind-set until it becomes God-centred. Thus, transformed “by the renewing of your mind” we ‘fit into’ God’s purpose, along with other believers and live out that new life in practical actions governed by allegiance to God and allowance for fellow believers. And all of that is sanctified by God the Holy Spirit.
